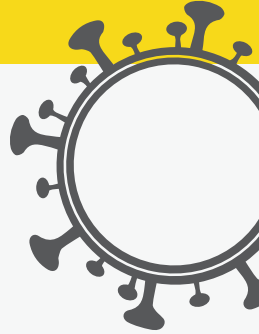

COVID-19 Hardship Fund

In association with Devon County Council, we have launched a Local Hardship Fund to support those whose financial situation has been affected by the current pandemic and are struggling for essentials for their household.

Test & Trace Support Payment

If you have been told by the NHS Track and Trace to self-isolate, either because you have tested positive for COVID-19 or you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive, you may be entitled to receive a lump sum payment of £500.

Benefits Calculator

You can complete a benefits calculator, such as the one at **entitledto.co.uk/benefits-calculator** to see which benefits you're entitled to. If you're already receiving benefits other than Universal credit, there is an option at the end of the calculation to do a comparison with what you would receive if you switched to Universal Credit.

Universal Credit

You may qualify for Universal Credit if you are on a low income. Universal Credit can help with rent payments, mortgage payments, and child care costs. You can apply for Universal Credit by completing an online application at gov.uk/universal-credit/how-to-claim or by calling **0800 328 5644**.

Housing Benefit

If you are in receipt of benefits other than Universal Credit, you may be eligible for Housing benefit towards your housing costs. You can apply for Housing Benefit by completing an application at: teignbridge.gov.uk/benclaim or by calling Teignbridge Council on **01626 361101** and asking to speak to benefit services.

Rent arrears

If you are having issues paying your rent, you may be eligible for a Discretionary Housing Payment. You will need to be in receipt of Housing Benefit or the Housing Element of Universal Credit to be eligible. You can download a form at: teignbridge.gov.uk/dhp or contact Teignbridge Council on **01626 361101** to request that a form is posted to you.

Mortgage Arrears

If you're having difficulty paying your mortgage, you may be eligible for help towards the interest payments. This help is called Support for Mortgage Interest (SMI). You can see whether you're eligible and apply at: gov.uk/support-for-mortgage-interest or call Jobcentre Plus on **0800 169 0310**. You can also contact your mortgage provider who may be able to offer a payment holiday, depending upon your circumstances.
